Ala, 8<sup>th</sup> December, [1771]

We arrived safely here from *Verona*<sup>1</sup> at the *Piccinis*<sup>2</sup> today at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, and will stay here overnight and then go on tomorrow. But tomorrow we will stay in Trent, as I have some *commissions* from Milan to deliver there. [5] By all appearances, we will be travelling towards Salzburg as you read this and arrive in the evening, if we do not come earlier. As soon as you receive this, open the little room so that it is not extremely cold, but *temperate*, for Wolfgang will not sleep in the back room, but in future in the little room,<sup>3</sup> and leave the door open so that it remains temperate. [10] I will give an answer in person to what you asked me in one of the 4 letters<sup>4</sup> of yours I found in *Verona*. The matter<sup>5</sup> is not without substance – that much I can say. Keep well, we kiss you both many 1 000 000 times, and I am as always your
